The Elizabeth project is an ongoing tree planting project lead by Felix Von-Moltke, Seb Fennel, Peter Marsden, and Eve Cavey. We've planted nearly 500 trees and there are plans for more!



Pupils from nearby primary schools also got involved in the planting, and several dozen pupils here have volunteered their time to help the efforts.

We've been planting a mixture of **Hawthorn**, **Blackthorn**, and some disease-resistant **Elm**.

INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS



The Earth Prize is an annual, global, environmental sustainability competition for teenage students that rewards the ideas and projects with the most potential to tackle environmental issues.

Several teams from the college participated, but Bactoplastics was a Finalist and runner-up and Veggie for Schools was an Earth Prize Scholar.

Here's Maks from team Bactoplastics:


"We are producing a complete protocol for industrial production of biodegradable plastics, polyhydroxyalkanoates, from food waste using genetically engineered

bacteria. Polyhydroxyalkanoates are already produced commercially, but their feasability is limited due to high production costs. This is the result of challenges in purification, high cost of the raw resources, and low production yield. We address all these issues in our method and through genetically modifying a special type of bacterium for enhanced plastic production."
